TITLE: Cultural Objects of Significance

GRADE LEVEL: Middle School

TIMELINE: 3 Hours

DESCRIPTION: Museum curators think carefully about what objects to display as part of exhibitions. Through curation, they weave stories that connect people and their experiences so we may reflect on their importance. In this exercise, you will be asked to draw or present an object that has cultural significance to you or your family. Guiding us through the history of the object and its significance to you or your family. As a group we will discuss the objects we have drawn or presented on and curate them based on themes we see emerge. Comparing similar experiences and

- Analyze a work of art.
- Create a work of art that conveys a meaning.
- Discuss how objects hold meaning.
- Reflect on how works of art celebrate people and their experiences.

SUGGESTED SCHEDULE

Step 1

Choose a cultural object that has significance to you or your family. Reflect on its importance or significance. Share with your peers your object and write about its significance, paying close attention to the similarities and differences between your object and theirs.

Step 2

Draw or present the object. Add color to your drawing or create a poster that illustrates the significance of the object you are presenting on. Write a short description as to its significance and reflect on the similarities and differences of your object to those of your peers.

Step 3

Students can write a short paragraph reflecting on the process they went through creating their drawing or the significance of the object. They may share their stories with their peers in small groups. In listening to their stories, they can begin curating which objects/images can go together based on the connections they are seeing emerge. They can share their findings with the larger group and exhibit the objects, illustrations, or research they have gathered in the classroom or school.
